#### Member Spotlight



Dr. Joseph Thornton, III is starting his 37<sup>th</sup> year leading Lester's Chapel, setting a record for the Southeastern Jurisdiction of the UMC. He was assigned when he arrived in Jackson as Headmaster of the Episcopal Day School in 1982. "My first impressions were most positive in that I know about the needs of rural churches. My favorable impressions grew year by year, and my fondest memories are embedded in the love that the church members have for each other, for us, and also that we have for them." Dr. Joe is the keystone of our church and what makes Lester's Chapel so unique and special.

### 130 Years Strong

Lester's Chapel United Methodist Church officially became a church in 1888. However, more than likely, the church was meeting sometime earlier under the belief that "For where two or three gathers together in My name, there am I with them." The congregation likely started during "camp meetings" and met in the homes of the members. It was not until William Still Lester donated the property where the original 30'x40' church was built, which is the central portion of today's sanctuary.

With an established "church home", members gathered around a wood burning stove that stood in the middle of the room. They met in Sunday school classes that were separated by sheets. Twice a month the traveling preacher would hold service in the cozy room, and the congregation grew in their Faith and Fellowship in this humble dwelling.

Fast forward to 2018, 130 years later, and the church has grown. The original building was expanded over the years to include Sunday School rooms that have doors instead of sheets, modern heating and cooling, and a fellowship hall. Our numbers have ebbed and flowed as time has passed, but the concept of faith and fellowship have remained as strong as ever. Whether our numbers have us bursting at the seams or making a scant joyful noise, we maintain our beloved tradition of opening our hearts, minds, and doors to all who seek to expand their Faith.
